

# Ramblings from the Reverend

Dear Friends,

Relationships are the foundation of who we are at this particular church. To be a part of the First Pres family is to, at least tacitly, agree to be involved in entering and nurturing relationships.

That is very Jesus-like, isn't it? The story of the gospels is the story of Jesus entering into relationships with others –Jesus as the Son of God initiating and creating a depth and a meaning to a variety of particular relationships.

Often times, of course, Jesus's relationships in the gospel accounts are surprising. They were for the people of Israel during the time of the gospels, and they are for us. We don't expect Jesus to be in relationship with that person, or to have the relationship deal with that issue or circumstance. It's evident that for the ones who reciprocated the relationship with Jesus that there was something about our Lord which nurtured trust in him.

Good relationships lead to trust. We don't trust folks we don't know. We don't trust folks who have not earned our trust. But when we know, and when we are known, trust is the gift that brings life to the relationship. Again, Jesus is the model. And he expects us to follow that model.

We do this kind of relationship well at First Pres; not perfectly, but well. And out of that relationship cultivation we build mutual trust.

The "Can I Ask That" gatherings have been a prime example of conversations built on mutual trust. They are a way in which we can have open conversations with each other on topics that can only be explored if that trust is there. These are the kinds of conversations where unanimous agreement is not the goal but listening and empathy are.

As I have participated in these conversations, I have been moved by the transparency of what is shared. I have been grateful for the active willingness to have a dialogue without judgment. I am aware of the vulnerability of what has been shared by beloved friends in this setting. I admire their courage. I also admire the grace of those who listen.

In particular, sexuality and gender are difficult topics for churches to talk about and yet many of us are talking about them. For some, this conversation about this topic is a bridge too far. Minds are made up, or there is not a personal connection, or it's simply too messy.

My opinion is that the conversations we are having or will be having about sexuality and gender are critical. We have friends, relatives, fellow believers for whom this is not an intellectual matter but a matter of identity.

I had a young queer Christian woman tell me that as she "came out" to herself, her initial conviction was that God hated her and she was God's mistake. That's not an intellectual or doctrinal abstract view, that is a deep cry to God and to the people of God about identity and worth. I am so glad we can be the kind of church that will enter into a relationship and a conversation with our queer brothers and sisters and those who love them.

I also believe that we have a reservoir of trust in each other that we can draw from to have these conversations. This is, for many of us, a test of our trust. Wasn't it easier when things seemed black and white,

when the relationships didn't require this level of vulnerability? And, yet the way of Jesus will always lead us to places where our trust in him; and through him, our trust with each other, will be tested and stretched.

Our relationships to each other are a gift from God. They reflect that God has actively pursued us for relationship with him. It is in those relationships with God and each other that we truly become the Body of Christ, the living metaphor of the church and our church. I give thanks to God that this particular part of the Body of Christ is the one I have been called to.




# Summer-time Women's Bible Study Mondays @ 6pm: June 5—July 24 Online or In-person

#### **FPC Financial Update**

- Pledged income for the fourth month of the year is \$4,040 favorable to budget. Non-Pledged income is \$52,577 favorable to budget.
- The expenses for the fourth month of the year are \$15,819 unfavorable to budget.
- Net church income/operations was \$62,527 favorable to a budget of -\$76,989 showing an income of -\$14,462.
- Note to financial statements: I have moved the Mark-to-Market Value Recognition line out

of the Church Income section and placed it below the Net Church Operations line so that net operations is not inflated/deflated by market movement of investments. You can see operations with the market value recognition on the last line of the report.


