

Sermon-based Guide for Reflection and Discussion

Week of September 12

Scripture: Genesis 2:18, Romans 12:15, Hebrews 2:10-13

Sermon Title: "It Is Not Good to be Alone"

Key Points:

God made us to be in community. God created us in his image and God lives in community; the Trinity by its nature is communal (Jesus saying, "I and the Father are one... It is better for me to leave so that the Holy Spirit may come). But Genesis 2 also tells us that God intends for our community to go beyond our relationship to God to live into relationships with each other.

The union of Adam and Eve represents marriage as a gift from God, but it also represents the broader communities that God gives – family, yes, but broader too. We are to belong to each other, to nurture and care for each other. This involves transparency and an active choice to be in community – trusting God to sustain and strengthen the communities to which he has called us.
